In this seminar you will get answers to the above and more, based on scientific research over many decades. On the practical day you will get an overview of this noninvasive hoofcare approach.

Part I - Day 1

The first day covers the basics of hoof anatomy, physiology, and hoof functions. It outlines how contraction and shoeing affects the hoof, and what to expect during the transition of a sound horse and/ or rehabilitation period of the lame or shod horse to the sound, high performance barefoot horse.

The afternoon will focus on the practical application of a healthy hoof shape as taught in the morning section. We will see a demonstration of our non-invasive trimming techniques on cadaver hooves and illustrative dissections. This section is also interesting for people of have attended previous ESANA Seminars.

Part II - Day 2

9 am - 5 pm

(Part I is a prerequisite for Part II) The second day begins by linking the hoof to the rest of the animal. The day then continues outlining environmental needs the for horse health and identifying the harmful conditions in conventional boarding. Learning how to optimize your boarding conditions (including nutrition and hoof care) complete the day.

The afternoon of the second day is spent with the introduction of the non-invasive technique of trimming healthy barefoot horses. Dissection of hoof bio-specimen for study will show the reason for correct trimming.

Please note, it is not realistic to learn barefoot hoof care in a couple of days and then apply it to a horse - which potentially does not have healthy feet at this point in time. We recommend you contact a professional to be guided, or consider our Professional's Course.

About Our Instructors

Thorsten Kaiser (New Zealand), SHI, BSc, Thorsten graduated as one of the first Hoofcare Professionals in New Zealand. Thorsten moved from Germany to New Zealand in 1997. After his transition from shod to barefoot and natural boarding conditions, and after a few 40-80km rides barefoot, Thorsten did his first 100 km ride barefoot in 2003. After that he was instrumental in getting a rules change for Endurance NZ to allow horses to go barefoot in longer rides, which paved the way for Australia Endurance to follow suit. Since 2008, Thorsten has been a full time trimmer and Hoofcare Professional Instructor. Thorsten gives seminars and teaches the SHP Professional's Course. He also heads the National WIHH Offices for both New Zealand and Australia. He continues to give seminars, talks and teaching, as well as hosts and participates in horse and hoofcare symposiums horse care with luminaires such as:
